Membership renewal requests for 2012 will be mailed out in October. As always, early renewals make the resulting paperwork tasks much easier for our volunteer membership workers. And for new members joining in October, their new membership will be for 2012, thereby giving a new member a few extra months of membership benefits.

Using our property is one of the more significant membership benefits. Members can use the property as their "big back yard." Those interested pay a deposit for a gate key making it easy to get onto the property. The only requirement is to treat our property with respect and keep it clean and in good

condition. In addition, a member can rent the IKE's property and lodge for family reunions, receptions or other family activity. A member can also rent the property as a sponsor for another group, such as a church fellowship outing or other club meeting. Rental rates are \$75/day with a \$75 refundable damage/cleanup deposit for member's get-togethers, and \$150/day with a \$150 refundable damage/cleanup deposit for member sponsored groups. **Bob Radke** is the rental manager for this activity, whose contact information is located elsewhere in this newsletter. The **Council of Great Lakes Governors** is a non-partisan partnership of the governors of the eight Great Lakes States, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin. In 1983, the region's governors joined forces to create the Council and tackle the severe environmental and economic challenges then facing the citizens of their States. In more recent years, the **Premiers of Ontario and Québec** have joined with the governors in advancing the high performance economy of the Great Lakes region.

The Great Lakes Governors share a dual stewardship for both the world's single largest source of fresh water and the economic heartland of North America. The Great Lakes contain one fifth of the world's fresh water. The region generates nearly 30% of our nation's gross domestic product and about 60% of all U.S. manufacturing. Today, the Council's governors lead strategic alliances to protect our region's natural resources and sustain our world-class economy. The governors' belief is that sound environmental policy makes good economic sense.

SAVE OUR STREAM (SOS) WORK (FUN THAT IS!)

Three Ike's showed up on a recent Saturday morning at 9:45am to help in the fall **Bear Creek** stream study. These are held twice a year with the next one scheduled for April 14, 2012. Three chapter members were able to step up for the occasion, **Bonnie Blacklidge**, **Georgia Donovan** and **Bob Stegmier**.

There were 5 teams measuring various stream criteria, collecting insects from the creek with "D" nets for 30 minutes, then three "pickers" at each site picking insects and putting them in specimen bags for later identification. I know at our site #1 we found scuds, Crane Fly larvae, likely Stone or May fly larvae and some small worms.

I worked there with **Pattie Anderson** and her son, **Matt**. The bugs were small because the large ones all matured and flew away so these insects are in the process of growing up for next year's hatches. The five study sites were from near the headwaters of the creek east of **Ramsdell Ave.** and **Daves St.** where the creek is about 4 feet wide and 6 to 10 inches deep down to # 5, which is just east of **Chauncey Ave.** As past chapter

president, **Jim Biener** often says, it was Easy, it was Fun and it was Rewarding. Yes it was, Jim. If you are interested in getting in on the action next April just get in touch with me.

KITCHEN IMPROVEMENTS DONATION CHALLENGE UPDATE

The response to last month's article regarding the donation challenge for kitchen improvements has been good. To date we have received \$806 in response to the article.

An anonymous member had contributed \$100 for the improvements and made the challenge. The member challenged the rest of the membership by pledging \$1 more for every \$5 contributed. The original \$100 is good until the total from the membership reaches \$500. Then the anonymous member will kick in again at the \$1 for \$5 rate. So far a total of \$51 of additional pledge has been earned. The kitchen improvements made to date cost approximately \$4500 with some additional electrical work needed beyond that. The maximum that can be raised through the challenge is \$500 from the anonymous member and \$2500 from our membership.

So let's keep the contributions coming for the needed improvements at our lodge. Remember that we are a 501-c3 organization and all of the donations are deductible on your Federal Income Tax Return. 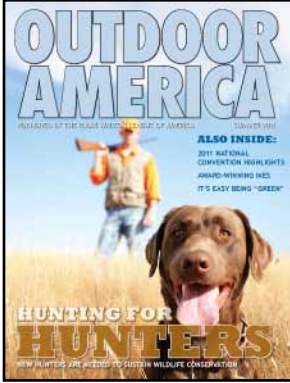
