KITCHEN IMPROVEMENTS DONATION CHALLENGE UPDATE

The response to last month's article regarding the donation challenge for kitchen improvements has been good. To date we have received an additional \$200 in response to the article. The total donated now stands at \$655. This amount along with the donation and pledge from an anonymous member puts the amount at \$798 given so far. The graph below indicates that we are almost 20% of the way to paying for the kitchen improvements.

The anonymous member challenged the rest of the membership by pledging \$1 more for every \$5 contributed. The kitchen improvements made to date cost approximately \$4500 with some additional electrical work needed beyond that. The maximum that can be raised through the challenge is \$500 from the anonymous member and \$2500 from our membership. However, we will accept donations after the challenge maximum is reached.

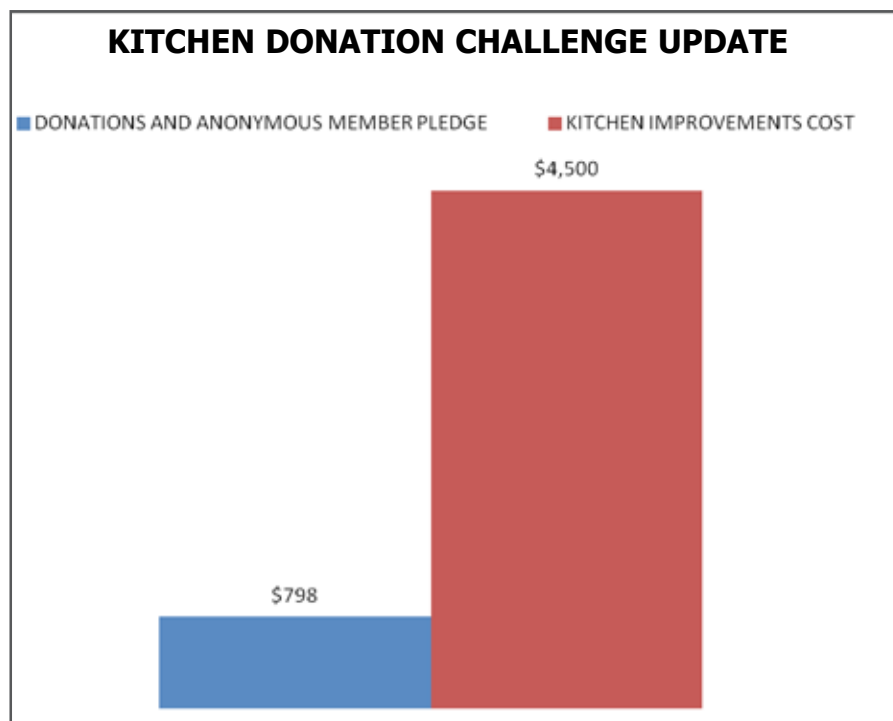

NEWS FLASH FROM 2011 HOW CONFERENCE DETROIT, MICHIGAN

The HOW (Healing Our Waters) Great Lakes Conference had exciting information I want to squeeze into this November newsletter. Deciding how and where to perform hydrologic separation of the Great Lakes from the Mississippi River basin is a critical step in preventing Asian carp from entering the Great Lakes and preventing the transfer of AIS between these two great water basins. Two significant groups began collaboration a couple of years ago (Great Lakes Commission and the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative) to determine how the separation can be accomplished. Their goal was to have their comprehensive study completed by January 2012 a full 2 1/2 years ahead of the USCOE.

The really good news is that the studies are on schedule and on budget. One detailed presentation showed where the five permanent separations would be and what the separation structures would be. Qualified professional firms were hired to do the study and engineering, and included close collaboration with all stakeholders involved including the USCOE. This is no small study and is costing just a little less than 2 million dollars.

Probably the most exciting news is that they plan to have this separation accomplished in five years. To me, this is an outstanding goal and will need all of the support of concerned IKEs, citizens, state agencies, congress and US Government units. I will report more on the 2011 HOW Conference in the next IKEs newsletter.
