Mike and Gerry Grimshaw were a couple of bachelor brothers who belonged to the Izaak Walton League for many years. They were easy to distinguish with their plaid shirts and hats with buttons representing their affiliation with numerous conservation groups. They spent most of their time in Indiana but joined our chapter when they moved to their cabin near Luther in the early 90's. Rain, snow or shine they never missed a chapter event.

Gerry died in 2004 and Mike in 2007. They left a sizeable estate to the Izaak Walton League of America Endowment. And, their estate keeps giving. Since Mike's death Great Lakes Energy has sent to the Endowment several rebates for electrical energy use while they lived in their cabin over the years. And, this year the Endowment will again be receiving rebates for the years 1993-95. While the rebates will probably be less than \$20 for

each year, it still goes into the Endowment's restricted fund to make grants for education and habitat projects. The chapter should take advantage of the availability of these and other grants from the Endowment.

You might consider a contribution the Endowment in your year-end giving. It would be money well spent.


